

AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE FOR EDUCATORS

June 1-3 • 8:30 a.m.-noon **1.0 CEUs**

This course will teach students the basics of American Sign Language (ASL). It will focus on educators in order to help them learn to utilize elements of the language, such as the alphabet and vocabulary. This will aid them in developing communication skills between deaf and hearing people.

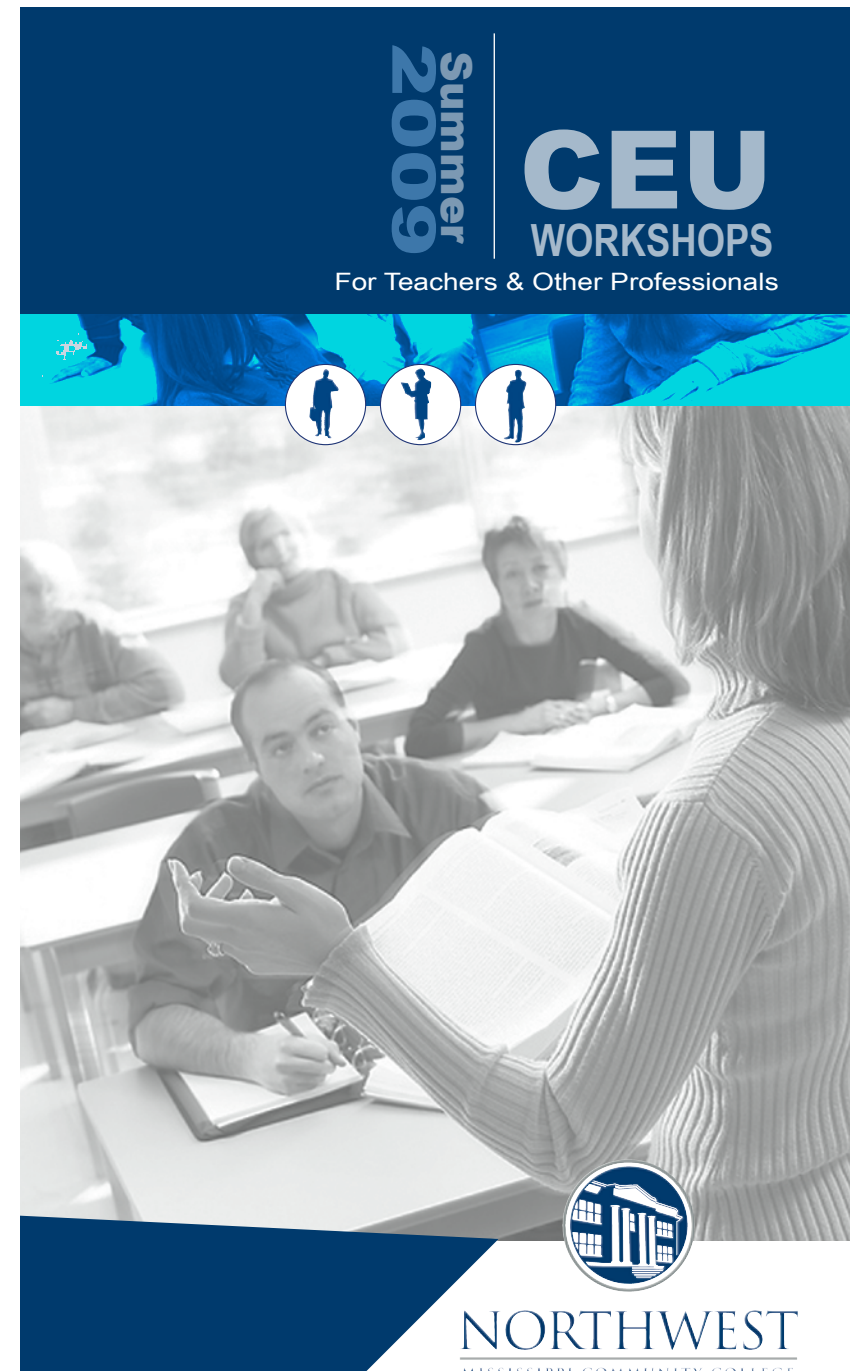
